Boaz Harvest Festival Car Show Plans

With the Boaz 50th Annual Harvest Festival just around the corner, the Boaz Area Chamber of Commerce has been busy finalized plans for the 50th Annual Harvest Festival Car Show.



This year's show, sponsored by *First Bank of Boaz*, will be held Saturday, October 4th, 2014 at the VF Outlet parking lot on Billy Dyar Boulevard, adjacent to historic downtown Boaz.

According to Peggie Haney, Chamber Director, anyone interested in pre-registering for the event may do so at the Boaz Area Chamber of Commerce office at 100 Bartlett Ave., Boaz, by September 25. The pre-registration entry fee is \$20.00. The event will also have onsite entry registration on October 4, from 8 am until 10 am. The onsite entry registration fee at the gate is \$25.00. Checks for either entry registration fee need to have checks made payable to the Boaz Area Chamber of Commerce. Parts vendors are also welcome with a booth fee of \$25.00. Food will also be available at the car show.

A Message from Superintendent Dr. Mark Isley

Dear Boaz Family,

I hope that everyone has enjoyed a peaceful, relaxing, and enjoyable summer with your family and friends. As superintendent, I am excited about the future of our school system and I am encouraged by reading your responses from your participation in the Serve First alternative to FLEX DAY this summer. To be a successful school system, you must be willing to serve others but you also must have a **vision** and **plan** to accomplish that vision. The vision for the Boaz City School System is an expectation of excellence everyday by everyone. So, we are in the process of developing our school system’s five-year strategic plan and the five-year capital plan to ensure that we have a **plan** to reach our **vision** for students, employees, and our community.

In late July (28th and 29th), selected teachers, administrators, support staff, community leaders, business owners, retired teachers, students, and citizens of Boaz **started** an important process of writing our school system’s **five-year strategic plan**. Our new strategic plan will serve as a blueprint that will chart our course over the next five years. AdvanceED and Alabama 2020 will provide the framework for system-wide accountability to ensure that all students are both college and career ready by graduation. We will focus on the following five GOALS at every school over the next five years:

1. The school maintains and communicates a purpose and direction that commit to high expectations for learning as well as shared values and beliefs about teaching and learning.
- 2.) The school operates under governance and leadership that promote and support student performance and school effectiveness.
- 3.) The school's curriculum, instructional design, and assessment practices guide and ensure teacher effectiveness and student learning.
- 4.) The school has resources and provides services that support its purpose and direction to ensure success for all students.
- 5.) The school implements a comprehensive assessment system that generates a range of data about student learning and school effectiveness and uses the results to guide continuous improvement.

It is our responsibility to design and implement project-based learning opportunities for our students that are rigorous, relevant, and foster positive relationships to provide our students an optimal opportunity to be prepared for college and career after high school. The five-year strategic plan will provide our school system a sense of direction as to where are we headed, what resources are we going to need, what is the best route to take, and how do we know when we have arrived. How about the five-year capital plan?

In the Fall of 2014 (October), we will be drafting our **five-year capital plan** by evaluating those areas within the school system that need immediate attention, those areas that need attention within the next year or two, and those areas that need attention within the next five years. We have made great strides this summer with the completion of the Boaz High School lunchroom, Boaz Middle School field-house, and a new multi-media screen/projector/new lunchroom tables project at Corley Elementary. And, due to a weather incident this summer at Boaz Middle School, we have a new roof, freshly painted walls, new bleachers ordered, and a new gym floor (completion estimated to be around October 1st). So, I am requesting your prayers and support by joining each other in **"unity"** from Boaz Elementary to Corley Elementary, from Corley Elementary to Boaz Intermediate, from Boaz Intermediate to Boaz Middle, from Boaz Middle to Boaz High and from Boaz High to across "the bridge" of life at L.F. Corley Stadium on graduation night to ensure that **our students** are both college and career ready. WE ARE BOAZ!!!!!!

Blessings in a Backpack

Hunger Doesn't Take Weekends Off

Students at Boaz High School are volunteering to participate in a very worthy cause, Blessings in a Backpack. In order to meet their goals they are asking for community donations. Below is information about the cause and also information about donating.

What Do We Do? *Blessings in a Backpack* provides elementary school children who are on the federal Free and Reduced Price Meal Program with a backpack of food to take home for 38 weekends during the school year. Backpack food includes easy-to-prepare, ready-to-eat foods, like granola bars, juice boxes, mac and cheese, and oatmeal.

Why Do We Do It? There are 20+ million children in this country who are at risk of hunger. The consequences of hunger are much more than a growling stomach. Poor nutrition can result in a weaker immune system, increased hospitalization, lower IQ, shorter attention spans, and lower academic achievement. Children are fed during the school week by federal government programs, but we want to make sure they're getting nutritional meals over the weekend, too.

How Much Does it Cost? \$80 - \$100 feeds one child on the weekends for one 38-week school year through the *Blessings in a Backpack* program. 50 kids at \$80 is \$4,000 to get started. 100% of money raised to fund a school goes to feeding that school.

Donating Funds Starting at as little as \$80 a year, you can provide a backpack to one child each weekend for an entire 38 week school year! All money donated is tax deductible since we are a 501(c)3 organization. Each donation will receive a tax-deductible letter in the mail within 4 - 6 weeks.

Snead State Opens New Academic Success Center



The Open House at Snead State Community College on Wednesday, Aug. 20, went just as most open houses do. Employees and students toured the new Academic Success Center and reviewed material available describing the services offered by the ASC. But what set this Open

House apart from others just like it are the vision and planning that went into the development of the Academic Success Center. "This is a culmination of a dream our College Strategic Planning envisioned several years ago. We wanted to take the success of our TRiO program, which serves a smaller number of students, and develop something that would serve all of our students. At the time, we called our idea 'TRiO on Steroids.' Through a lot of discussion, planning and review, our idea is now called the 'Academic Success Center,'" said Snead State President Dr. Robert Exley.

The role of the ASC is to provide tutoring support for students with one goal in mind – **student success**. The plan for the ASC may have begun as part of a strategic planning meeting at the College, but it has become the focus of the College's Quality Enhancement Plan required through for reaccreditation with SACSCOC.

The ASC houses:

- ◆ A learning resource lab that includes a computer lab
- ◆ Access to online tutoring
- ◆ Course syllabi and review materials for select courses
- ◆ Small and large group tutoring sessions led by peer tutors
- ◆ One-on-one tutoring will also be available for select courses
- ◆ The ASC will host workshops for students addressing topics such as study skills, college navigation skills, classroom etiquette, resume building, interview preparation and more

"The ASC provides support services that are designed to improve academic performance," said Quality Enhancement Plan Coordinator Dr. Dustin Smith. "We don't want students to drop classes or drop out of college because they are struggling with the coursework. We want to help them be successful, so they stay on track to graduating from Snead and move forward with their educational and career paths."
